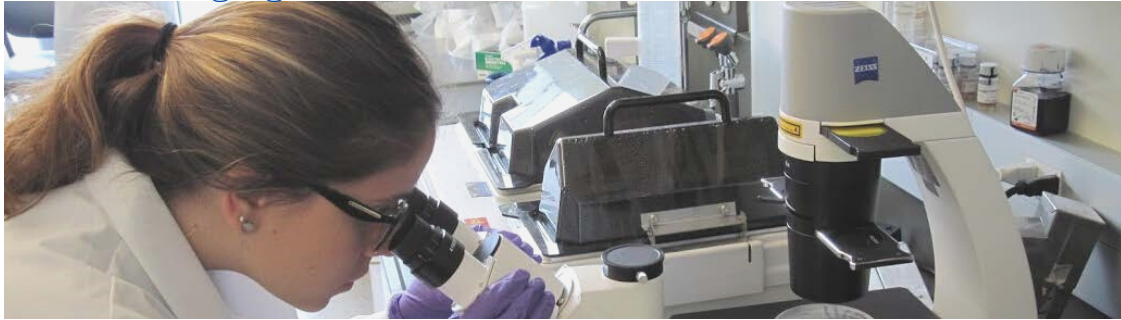




Post-Baccalaureate Fellowship

WHAT IS THE UMB DF/HCC POST-BACCALAUREATE PROGRAM?

The fellowship engages talented, highly motivated recent college graduates in full-time mentored, cancer research experiences in research environments across Dana-Farber/Harvard Cancer Center and UMass Boston campuses.

Program features that prepare fellows for careers in cancer research-related fields include the following:

- Guidance with graduate application/admission process
- Holistic mentorship & support
- Career-readiness workshops
- Engagement with the UMB DF/HCC Partnership community
- Scientific Seminars
- Conference assistance

PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY

- The program is open to those who have attained a bachelor's degree within the past two years and who have significant research interest & experience.
- Upon completing the fellowship, trainees are expected to pursue doctoral study in cancer-related or social-behavioral research.



Prospective applicants must meet the following criteria:

- Have US citizenship or permanent residency
- Have a competitive academic record
- Be a member of a group underrepresented in science careers*
- Have obtained a bachelor's degree by **August, 2022**

*African American/Black, Hispanic, American Indian/Alaska Native, Native Hawaiian, Pacific Islander, first-generation college-goer, and/or from low socioeconomic status (SES) backgrounds



ABOUT THE PARTNERSHIP: Since 2002, the UMass Boston–Dana-Farber Harvard Cancer Center (DF/HCC) Partnership has focused on addressing health disparities in underserved populations and on improving research, training, & outreach opportunities for students, faculty, and scientists. The partnership connects UMass Boston researchers with clinicians and researchers at DF/HCC and supports collaborative investigations aimed at understanding and reducing cancer and cancer disparities.
